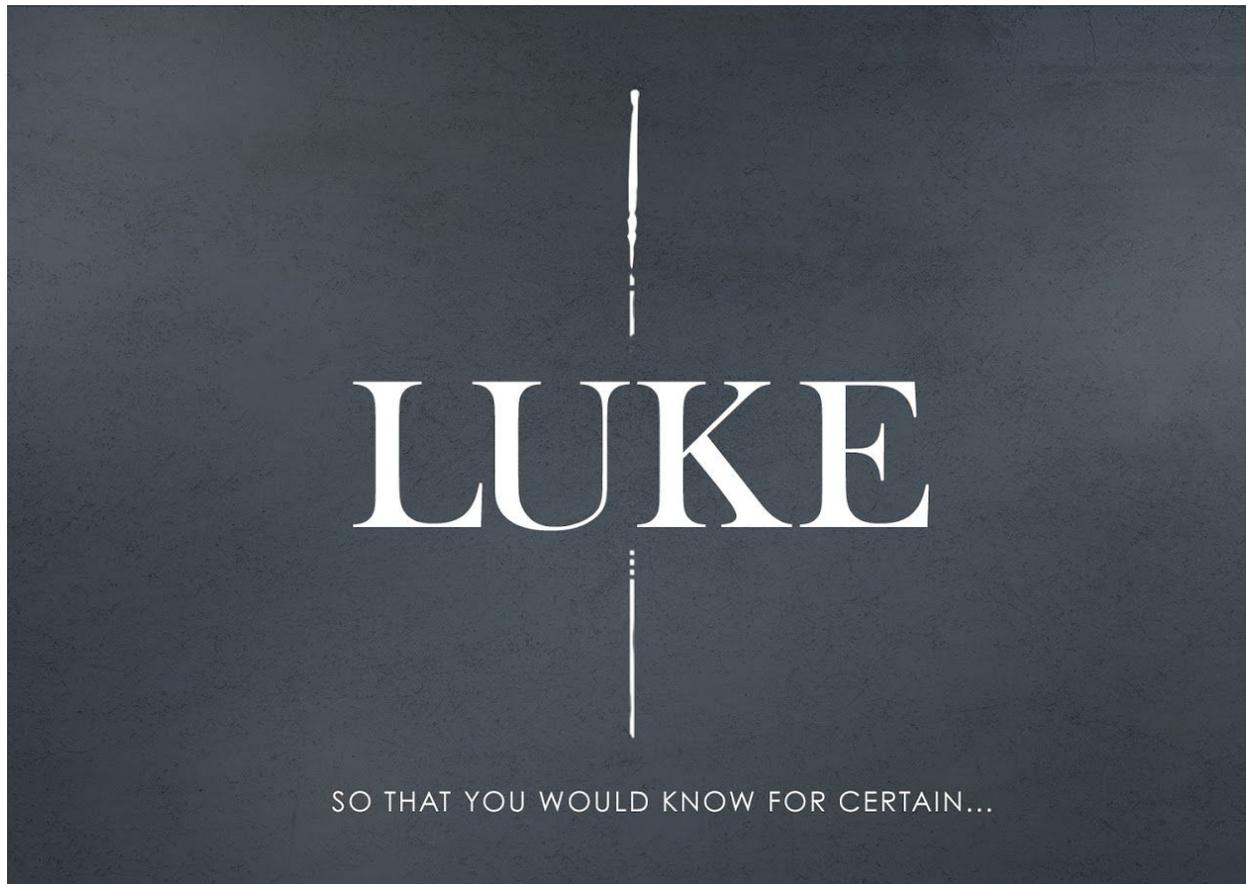


Application Questions

Chapter 1:26-56



Introduction

In this passage, Luke continues to press into two central themes that we will see in his letter; God uses the meek and the humble to accomplish His purposes, and nothing is impossible for Him. For the second time in Luke's letter, we read about a special encounter with God's messenger sent to bring news of His purpose and plan and how He includes humanity in it.

Questions

1. ICE BREAKER- What's "your song" or a song that takes you back to a certain place and time quicker than any other song?
2. What do you think is so powerful about this song that Mary writes in response to God's work in her life?
3. It had to have been incredibly difficult for Luke to write about the virgin birth (as a physician). Why do you think this would have be significant for him?
4. Many times, we brush over the stories of the impossible in Scripture because we've heard them so many times- while we have the tendency to maximize our circumstances. What's a place in your life right now that you need to remember that nothing is impossible for God, even_____?
5. When you feel that God is asking something of you, what are your typical hesitations centered around? (ie. comfort, control, logic, etc...)
6. Has there ever been a place in your life where you feel you might have missed out (or almost missed out) on something incredible because of disobedience?
7. How do you magnify the Lord in your relationships and conversation?
8. Where are some places that you need to focus your words and deeds to make Christ look big to those around you?
9. Where might the Lord be wanting to do something THROUGH you at the moment and season in your life?
10. In what areas do you need to have a higher and more hopeful expectation of God's work in your life and in the world?
