Our Hope for the Church

There were so many wonderful and talented people involved in the making of this guide in order for it to be a helpful resource for you as you reflect upon the glorious good news of the *Ascension* and *Pentecost*. It is our prayer and our hope, as the Church and for the Church, that as you use this guide you would Celebrate the King:

- By worshipping Jesus with all that you are as you reflect upon and entrust yourself to the Sovereignty of God in your life.
- By developing healthy rhythms of the "cruciform" life, establishing and maintaining order within this chaotic world.
- By walking alongside your sister and brother, bearing one another's burden in this time of continued crisis in our country and around the world.
- By *living* out the Kingdom in how you serve your neighbor and sharing the reason for the hope you have in Christ Jesus.

If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God.

Colossians 3:1

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But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God, waiting from that time until his enemies should be made a footstool for his feet. For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are being sanctified.

Celebration of the King

At the cross Jesus conquered sin, and in his resurrection defeated death, putting to shame all rulers and authorities in heaven and on earth. It is because of this most magnificent victory that God the Father has highly exalted him above all and enthroned him as King over the universe (Philippians 2:6-11). The commencement of Jesus' glorious reign over the cosmos as the risen King is what is known as the *Ascension* (Acts 1:1-11), when he ascended to the right hand of the Father; and *Pentecost* is the day when he poured out his Spirit (Acts 2) in order that his Church may live as the rightful citizens of his heavenly Kingdom.

Therefore, as we embrace the full story of the gospel, we are to immerse ourselves in the ongoing reality of the *Ascension* and *Pentecost*, by rejoicing in the glorious reign of Christ the King, who empowers us to live out his Kingdom in the world through his Spirit. Therefore, while Easter is the day in which the Church most rightly and extravagantly celebrates the victory of Jesus Christ on the cross, the subsequent weeks are meant to be an ongoing parade to celebrate the reign of Jesus Christ as our King.

How to Use this Guide

This guide is designed to reflect upon and rejoice in the cosmic reign of Jesus and our loyal service to the King, in prayer, in Scripture, and in reflection. Each day of the guide provides a form of worship to shape the disposition of our heart, to set rhythms of worship for our soul, and to reflect upon *Ascension* of our Lord Jesus Christ and the pouring out of the Spirit at *Pentecost*. The aim is to approach the throne of God's grace together as his people–established by his grace, formed by his Word, and sanctified by his Spirit–for our good and for his glory.

Seeing how this devotional is digital, you may find it helpful to use a journal in which to write your daily thanksgiving, Scripture reflections, and further prayers.

For music to inform and form your celebration of the King check out this playlist.

The Daily Practices

The following Daily Practices serves as a template, to be used as closely or as loosely as you find helpful.

• The Call to Prayer

Each morning will begin with a Scripture that invites us to meet with God and respond to him in prayer. Each call to prayer is connected to the area in the world over which God is sovereign that is introduced each Sunday.

• Time of Gratitude

Whereas the week leading up to Easter focus on confession and repentance, the weeks following Easter focus on thanksgiving and praise. Each day we will practice the discipline of giving thanks by recounting three (3) things for which we are grateful within the previous 24 hours. As the apostle Paul commends, let us "give thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Ephesians 5:20).

The Lord's Prayer

When asked how to pray, Jesus provided his disciples what is known as the "Lord's Prayer" (Matt. 6:9-13; Luke 11:1-4). This prayer can serve as a comprehensive framework to guide our prayers on what is most essential. Each day of the week we will pray through one line of the Lord's Prayer, focusing on that particular emphasis of the prayer. In this way, we will pray the entire Lord's Prayer throughout each week one day at a time. (For an overview and further explanation, see Appendix 3, pp. 87-88.)

• Scripture and Reflection

Each day we will have a particular passage of Scripture that we will read and reflect upon. The passage for each day will be related to the theme of the week, which focuses on a particular area over which God is sovereign. The passage of Scripture will come from a different part of biblical canon–Monday: the Old Testament; Tuesday: the Gospels; Wednesday: the Psalms; and Thursday: the Epistles. Friday and Saturday will walk us through the sermon series texts in Acts and corresponding major texts, which will prepare us for the <u>sermon series</u> at Exchange for that Sunday.

• Praying through the Mission of Exchange

We are committed to the Mission of Exchange, because we believe it is the mission that God has given the church: we exist to be a people, who enjoy the glory of God, equip the people of God, and extend the love of God. Each day we will pray through one of the elements of this mission: by praising God for one of his attributes (enjoy the glory of God); praying for God to cultivate in us a particular virtue or asking him to bless one of the ministries of the church (equip the people of God); and praying for a need in the world or mission of the church throughout the world (extend the love of God).

The Commission to Serve

Each day ends with a commission from God's Word to serve the King by extending his love to the world. Just as we begin with the Scripture, we will end with Scripture, in order that our time is framed by God's Word.

The Design of this Guide

The form and content of this devotional is purposefully designed to orient our souls, hearts, and minds to the immutable truth that *Jesus is King*. Therefore, every element is meant to serve as a movement within a symphony that sings the song of God's sovereignty. The following elements of the guide are intended to shape how we behold our Risen Savior and celebrate our Ascended King.

The Realms of God's Sovereignty throughout each Week

Each week will focus on a different realm over which God reigns (for an explanation of the images see Appendix 2, pp.83-87). The Call to Prayer and the Scripture Reading for that day is intentionally related to the particular emphasis for that week.

The Enthronement Psalms on Sundays

There is a particular grouping of psalms (Psalms 93, 95-99) that emphasize the Kingship of Yahweh. Each of the psalms is marked by the phrase, "Yahweh Reigns" or "Yahweh is Enthroned" (יְהוָה מָּלָרְ) and have thus been labeled as "The Enthronement Psalms." Since the New Testament presents Jesus' salvific ministry (*Crucifixion*, *Resurrection*, and *Ascension*) as his enthronement over the heavens and the earth, each Sunday will feature one of these psalms to reflect upon Jesus, the Victorious King.

Sermon Series through Acts

As the Ascension of Jesus Christ presses upon us to consider and celebrate his sovereignty over the cosmos, this theme will contribute to the current sermon series at Exchange Church in the book of Acts. Acts 2 will help us study the birth of the church. It gives us a beautiful picture of a unified people around what matters most. We will also briefly look at Acts 3 and get a picture of Christ that fills us with wonder and amazement. Throughout it all, God is sovereign and working out his good and perfect will for His glory and our good.

Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.

Romans 8:33-34

The Good News of the Ascension and Pentecost

It may seem to be a strange time to focus on the sovereignty of God, but perhaps this is the most appropriate time. It seems as if the world as we know it is becoming undone right before our very eyes. This last year of the COVID-19 global pandemic has drastically and dramatically altered everything about our lives. It has isolated us from one another. It has crippled the economy. It has taken hundreds of thousands of lives. It has brought governments to their knees. Although we knew it in our hearts before, this crisis has forcefully reminded us that the world is not as it should be, that the things of this world cannot be our security, and that this world as it is ultimately is not our home.

Yet, even as the world free falls into chaos, we are not without hope. In Christ Jesus we always have good news. The good news of Jesus' *Death* is that we are forgiven and cleansed from our sin, making us whole and right before the Father. The good news of Jesus' *Resurrection* is that we have the promise of eternal life in the new heavens and the new earth, where all the sad things of the world come untrue.

But what about now? What about this present time in between Jesus' *Resurrection* and ours, while the earth gives way and the mountains be moved into the heart of the seas? This is where the good news of Jesus' *Ascension* comes in. This oft-overlooked event of Jesus' ministry is essential to comprehending his ongoing mission to his people and our enduring hope in his glory.

At the end of his gospel (Luke 24:50-53) and at the beginning of the book of Acts (Acts 1:1-11), Luke records that forty days after Jesus was raised from the dead with his new resurrected body, Jesus ascended into heaven, where he sits at the right hand of God the Father (1 Peter 3:22). This event signifies Jesus' rightful exaltation and enthronement as King over the universe. And although God has always been sovereign over his creation (Psalm 24:1), the *Ascension* of Jesus means that all those who have put their faith in him may also participate in the glorious reign of the risen King—the one who is fully God and fully human, in whom heaven and earth are being reconciled (Colossians 1:19-20).

But if Jesus has ascended to the right hand of the Father how exactly do we experience the first fruits of the resurrected life found in Christ Jesus? It is important to realize that *Ascension* does not mean that Jesus vanished in the heavens abandoning us here on earth (John 14:18). Having been given authority as King over the heavens and the earth, Jesus promised his disciples that he would always be with them (Matthew 28:20). In fact, he tells his disciples

it is to their advantage that he goes to the Father, in order that the Holy Spirit may come to us (John 16:7), giving us access to his presence always.

This is where the day of *Pentecost* comes in, which occurred fifty days after Jesus' *Resurrection* and ten days after his *Ascension* (Acts 2). *Pentecost* refers to the long-awaited-for-day (Isaiah 32:15; Joel 2:28–32) when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the Church. What this means for the Church is that *through* the Spirit we have full access to the ascended King, that we are transformed into the Living Temple in whom the presence of God is manifest, and that we are empowered to live out the Kingdom of God in this world as pilgrims in a strange land awaiting our Heavenly country to come.

Therefore, because Jesus has ascended to the right hand of the Father, he is exalted as King over the world and has empowered us to reign with him through his Spirit.


So, what does the *Ascension* and *Pentecost* specifically mean for us today, especially in the midst of this current crisis?

- Jesus is King and he is in Control—While it appears that the world is collapsing beneath us, we can take heart that God is fully in control every aspect of our life today. This does not mean that we will not face difficulty or trial for this is not our home yet; but it does mean that in this world we can find our refuge in him who is the true and faithful King. Therefore, we need not fear but can joyfully trust that he is working all things together for his glory and for our good (Romans 8:28).
- Jesus is with You and for You—For many, if not all, we are facing an unprecedent event that is demanding much of us at every level. We will struggle with doubt and fear. We will fall short. But thankfully, we have a King who knows exactly all that we are going through experiencing the fullness of death itself (4:13-14); a King who, after defeating death, is "seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in heaven" (8:1); a King who "always lives to make intercession" for us (7:25). In other words, at every moment the Ascended King is faithfully and constantly praying for you and me, giving us his strength, his comfort, and his presence through his Spirit.

Since Jesus has ascended to the right hand of the Father and given us his Spirit, we have a King to celebrate, granting us a living hope in this life as we await the life to come. Therefore, no matter what you are going through today, take heart that Jesus is King and has overcome the world (John 16:33)—he has gone before you and goes with you because he loves you.

God Reigns over Life and Death

Week 1



We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God.

Romans 6:9-10

God Reigns over Life and Death

Week 1 | Reflection

Imagine the difference between watching a movie for the first time and seeing it a second time. How does your vantage point change on the second viewing? You might still feel the drama or jump at a scary moment, but now you know the end of the story. Having seen the resolution, the anxiety or fear you had at first is eased. You can put these hard moments into proper perspective knowing that the story resolves for the good of the characters. So too, by knowing the end of our story, we can have proper perspective in today's anxieties or triumphs or pain. Since God has triumphed over death bringing life—as was demonstrated in the Resurrection of Jesus—our life today is leading us through a story greater than we could ever imagine. In this story, death is not our finale but the beginning of a glorious second act.

With this hope in mind, David could say with confidence, "My body also rests securely" (Psalm 16:9). Paul trusted God to bring him "safely into his heavenly kingdom" (2 Tim. 4:18). Both were convinced that something greater was happening beyond their death that gave them confidence for life. Can we say the same? Can we trust him with our death as well as our life? For us, death is not an eternal sting but a sweet release into the arms of the One who has sovereignly led us all of our days. We can find peace and security in knowing that God is in control of both death and life.

Time of Gratitude

"Give thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Eph. 5:20). Take this time to give thanks to God for three (3) specific things from the last 24 hours.

Praying the Lord's Prayer: "Our Father who are in Heaven, Hallowed by thy Name"

Who in Heaven can be compared to you, God? Who among the sons of the mighty can be likened to you, Lord? Truly, who in heaven do we have but you? And on earth who is your equal? In every single way that counts, you are not like us. You are complete when we are broken. You are constant while we are tossed about by the emotion and circumstance of this present moment. Thank you that you never change, and that in your case that's a very good thing. We love you. Amen.

Scripture Reading from the Old Testament: Deuteronomy 30

- 1. How do you see the sovereignty of God in this passage?
- 2. How might God be calling you into obedience today?

Praying the Mission of Exchange: "Enjoy the Glory of God"

Attribute of God to Praise: God is Life

God, thank you that you are the creator of life. Thank you that you created all that we see and all that we ourselves are. Remind us that you are still in the work of bringing life to dead places, and that nothing is impossible for you. We pray that we would be a people who are easily able to see our Maker at work around us, bringing beauty from ashes, and life from death.

Commission to Serve the King: Romans 6:13-14

Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from *death* to *life*, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness. For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.



Call to Prayer: Psalm 34:22

The LORD redeems the life of his servants; none of those who take refuge in him will be condemned.

Time of Gratitude

"Give thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Eph. 5:20). Take this time to give thanks to God for three (3) specific things from the last 24 hours.

Praying the Lord's Prayer: "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven"

Lord we fight for our own kingdoms with a fervor that never ceases to surprise me—our kingdom; our will. But you show us a better way. You trade our sad, failing kingdom for your own. Our wills traded in for the wise rulings of a King whose ways are above our ways and whose thoughts are better than my thoughts. Your kingdom will stand, ours is already falling. We submit with joy to your leading in our lives today. Amen.

Scripture Reading from the Gospels: John 5:19-29

- 1. How do you see the sovereignty of God in this passage?
- 2. How might God be calling you into obedience today?

Praying the Mission of Exchange: "Equip the People of God"

Virtue to Cultivate: Faith

Lord, begin a new work of Faith in our hearts. We pray you would bring to life the embers of faith we once had in your goodness, your salvation, your sovereignty in the world. We ask for you forgiveness that we have allowed other things to take your place, to comfort us and console us in times of trouble. Thank you that you have promised to help us believe, even in this we are not left to our strength.

Commission to Serve the King: 1 Peter 4:10-11

As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: whoever speaks, as one who speaks oracles of God; whoever serves, as one who serves by the strength that God supplies—in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. To him belong glory and dominion forever and ever.



Call to Prayer: Psalm 18:46

The LORD lives, and blessed be my rock, and exalted be the God of my salvation

Time of Gratitude

"Give thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Eph. 5:20). Take this time to give thanks to God for three (3) specific things from the last 24 hours.

Praying the Lord's Prayer: "Give us this day our daily bread"

Thank you, Jesus, that you care about our daily bread. Thank you that over and over again in your Word you tell us to ask you for what we need. You are not a God who is unfamiliar with what it is to be human, or what it is to be in need of the physical things that sustain us. God you are good, and you do good, so we ask your mercy to provide for us this week. In each and every way. These are strange days, but you are still the God who sees us and knows just what we need even before we ask. We trust you today, Jesus. Thank you for giving us what we need. Amen.

Scripture Reading from the Psalms: Psalm 16

- 1. How do you see the sovereignty of God in this passage?
- 2. How might God be calling you into obedience today?

Praying the Mission of Exchange: "Extend the Love of God"

Need in the World to be Restored: Death

We pray for our Exchange mission team in Costa Rica this week. We pray that they would see people today as you see them. We pray that they would wake up ready to share the Gospel today. That they would shine like lights in a dark place. That they would represent you well in thought and deed. Challenge them today Jesus to live like you and for you.

Commission to Serve the King: Galatians 5:13-14

For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."



Call to Prayer: Psalm 145:16

You open your hand; you satisfy the desire of every living thing.

Time of Gratitude

"Give thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Eph. 5:20). Take this time to give thanks to God for three (3) specific things from the last 24 hours.

Praying the Lord's Prayer: "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" We have sinned, Lord. We know that and you know that. So, in your grace, have mercy on us, for we know that we cannot fix ourselves. Search us, O God, and know our heart. Try us and know our thoughts. And see if there be any grievous way in us, and lead us in the way everlasting. Jesus, we pray this for ourselves and for all your people. We thank you, God, that you care enough about us to continue the work of changing our hearts, and conforming us into the image of your son. Amen.

Scripture Reading from the Epistles: Romans 8

- 1. How do you see the sovereignty of God in this passage?
- 2. How might God be calling you into obedience today?

Praying the Mission of Exchange: "Enjoy the Glory of God"

Attribute of God to Praise: God is Omnipotent

We praise you God that you are all powerful. As people with felt limitations, we cannot even fathom what this means but thank you that your power and might have no limits at all. You are able to do anything, at anytime, anywhere. We pray you would plant this truth deep down in our hearts as a body of Christ. We ask that this would change the way we pray as a people, that our hearts would be confident in You. Thank you that nothing is impossible for our mighty Father.

Commission to Serve the King: Titus 2:7-8

Show yourself in all respects to be a model of good works, and in your teaching show integrity, dignity, and sound speech that cannot be condemned, so that an opponent may be put to shame, having nothing evil to say about us.



Call to Prayer: Psalm 54:4

Behold, God is my helper; the Lord is the upholder of my life.

Time of Gratitude

"Give thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Eph. 5:20). Take this time to give thanks to God for three (3) specific things from the last 24 hours.

Praying the Lord's Prayer: "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil"

The world is wrecked with sin. At each turn, a chance to fall into evil. But you already know that. Would you not only deliver us from the evil inside and around us, but also lead us away from temptation? We are failing in this. But you have already won the battle, Jesus. Show us your ways. Lead us in your truth. We will follow you with joy. Amen.

Scripture Reading from the Sermon Series: Acts 2:25-28

- 1. In this passage, how do you see the sovereignty of God in the face of fear?
- 2. How might God be calling you into obedience today?

Praying the Mission of Exchange: "Equip the People of God"

Praying the Lord's Prayer: "For Thine is the Kingdom, the Power, and the Glory, forever and ever. Amen" You promise that the sad and bad and hard of this world will one day be made perfectly whole. But that day is not today. While we wait, we ask that you would still show us your kingdom, your power, your glory here on earth. Encourage our hearts as we walk roads that do not yet make sense to us. Remind us that we are pilgrims here, our home is another Country. Lead us further in and further up, Lord. In Jesus name, Amen.

Mission of the Church in the World: Pray for the Southeast Asian Peoples



Week 2



He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities all things were created through him and for him. God Reigns over All of Creation

Week 2 | Reflection

There are two categories: creation and Creator. Scripture leaves no room for ambiguity about who God is and about who we are.

"I am the Lord, and there is no other, besides me there is no other God"
- Isaiah 45:5

God is undoubtedly in authority over His creation. I think that looking at the complexity of life on this planet makes it easy to believe in a Creator, but it is misguided to think that God has set creation in motion, and then abandoned us.

In the Scriptures this week, you will read that it is also God who sustains creation. All the processes that seem to "just happen" - the turning of the seasons, turning of the tides, turning of the planet on its axis - all occur under His authority. As the disciples discovered on a boat in the sea of Galilee, you will also see that Jesus is fully God, fully sovereign over creation.

The Lord is still reigning today! He will one day fully reveal this with a renewed heaven and earth, with no more crying or pain (Rev 21:1-7). These things should humble us before the Lord, draw us to worship, and move us to declare Him as Lord over our lives.

Sunday | April 11

Celebrate the King who reigns over all of Creation.

Use this guide of prayer, in whole or in part, as the Lord leads you.

Call to Prayer: Psalm 9:7-8

But the LORD sits enthroned forever; he has established his throne for justice, and he judges the world with righteousness; he judges the peoples with uprightness.

Time of Gratitude

"Give thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Eph. 5:20). Take this time to give thanks to God for three (3) specific things from the last 24 hours.

Prayer for the Church

O God of all power and majesty, you created the heavens and stretched them out. You formed the earth and all that comes from it. You give the breath of life to all who walk on the face of the earth. Jesus, you conquered sin and death and now reign victorious. You are Lord; glory is due your name. The former things have come to pass; we now await the new things you will bring through the Holy Spirit. We rejoice to be gathered in your name. Alleluia! Accept our praises and petitions. *Amen.* [WSB, 660]

Scripture Reading from the Enthronement Psalm: Psalm 93

- 1. How do you see the sovereignty of God in this passage?



Week 3 | Reflection



God Reigns over Suffering

Week 4 | Reflection

We are managers of all kinds of things. We manage people at work, we manage our home's and our kids' schedules, we manage our money, we manage our to-do list or our obligations at work. These are all good things and remind us how God has given us dominion over things in our world. Eventually though we are reminded that we are not quite given dominion over ALL things and that there are just simply things outside of our control. Nothing awakens us more to this than walking through a season of suffering. Instantly we realize we are not in control and quite simply, we never were. God uses these times to remind us we are broken people living in a broken world. Questions fill our minds while we wrestle with God over our sorrow and grief. Why did this have to happen? Why did you allow this? Not me, this is for other people. Why can't you just fix this?

All over Scripture we see God's people wrestle with Him as they try to come to an understanding of the suffering that He allows. Scripture offers us at least two handles as we grapple for answers. First, God promises His presence in the reality of our current suffering. He offers hope in Lamentations 3:22–23, "Because of the LORD's faithful love we do not perish, for his mercies never end. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness!" Our God faithfully walks in the fire with us and promises new mercies each new day. While we cannot control the situation or the outcome, we trust in the One who holds all of it in his hands, believing it is in his sovereign control and His purposes and plans for us are good. "How great is your goodness that you have stored up for those who fear you and accomplished in the sight of everyone for those who take refuge in you" (Psalm 31:19).

Second, Scripture also teaches us to look to things unseen, the future restoration of all things. Our suffering is not only in His sovereign loving hands, but by allowing this, he stirs in us a longing for a better home. We are reminded that we live in a fallen world and this world alone cannot and will not satisfy. Suffering has a way of making us ache for our future home, longing for the restoration of all things. 2 Corinthians 4 reminds us to not give up! "For our momentary light affliction is producing for us an absolutely incomparable eternal weight of glory." One glorious day we will see with our own eyes the restoration of all things, and we will be with Jesus in our eternal home, where all the sad things become untrue.



God Reigns over Sin

Week 5 | Reflection

Far too often the old nature of sin pulls me towards disobedience and the works of the flesh. Satan tries to convince me that I am a slave to sin. I identify most with Romans 7:21, "So I discover a new law: When I want to do good, evil is present with me." But we must not forget the power of Christ and his work: his death, burial, descent, his resurrection, and his ascent. In Romans 6 we are told that we are no longer enslaved to sin since we have died to sin in Christ (Rom 6:6-9). The body that was ruled by sin in now powerless. But often, far too often, sin rears its ugly head within me. So, what can we do? Romans 6:12-14 tells us,

Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body, so that you obey its desires. And do not offer any parts of it to sin as weapons for unrighteousness. But as those who are alive from the dead, offer yourselves to God, and all the parts of yourselves to God as weapons for righteousness. For sin will not rule over you because you are not under the law but under grace.

The answer, in short, is draw close to God and seek to please him. Easier said than done, but not when we look to Christ and seek to draw close to him. He is powerful enough to help us walk freely and his Spirit is quick to aid us.

Week 6 | Reflection

If I'm honest, submitting to God's sovereignty fluctuates between a feeling of peace because I know He is able and trustworthy, and frustration because I want to be the one in control. There often is a mental struggle to put to death pride and selfishness, to take my thoughts captive and trust in the truth that He is God and I am not. I think this can be especially challenging when dealing with God's sovereignty over time and possessions. The idea of this is "my time" comes to mind so quickly I didn't even see the enemy notch that arrow onto his bow. And thoughts like "I've worked hard to earn money. I went to school, did the homework, learned and practiced my craft, etc. I've put in the hard work and my paycheck is my due reward. I will now use this money however I choose, because it is mine" may seem like legitimate reasoning--but it is misguided. I have 24 hours of time to use today because God has given it to me- not because of any smart scheduling on my part. The mental ability to learn, the physical ability to actually do my job-all gifts from God. The fact that I woke up today and even took a breath is by the grace of God. He gives me life and He rightfully reigns over how I use the time and things He has given me. Louie Giglio reminds us "The goal of our faith isn't to settle into a nice comfortable job and a nice easy routine. The goal is to say, 'God, I'm available for whatever you want me to do." (Goliath Must Fall, 127). Does this mindset come naturally? Not for me! It is a daily (sometimes hourly) fight to reorient my mind and affections away from the usurper to the throne of my heart, myself, to the rightful King, Jesus.

In moments when we are quick to revisit those questions, may we begin asking, or better yet, remembering—Who. Before Christ made the proclamation to Peter, he asked him the question, "Who do you say that I am?" To which Peter replied," the Christ, the Son of the living God."

May we take solace and joy, knowing that in every present and future threat that assails the Church, our security rests in our Savior and his sovereignty. No person or circumstance will prevail against the people who are called by Him.

Week 8 | Reflection

The sovereignty of God over every soul. What does that mean? The day of Pentecost gives us a picture of the sovereignty of God over every soul. God created us for relationship with Himself for all of eternity. God also allowed us to have free will, to follow Him or to choose our own way. Sin broke the ability for us to live in close relationship to him, but he pursues us and has provided a way for us to come back to Him and have eternal life with Him.

God could have sent the Holy Spirit to the disciples quietly; instead there was a loud noise that drew a multitude together. He could have sent the Spirit to them at anytime and any place. He chose Jerusalem during the feast of weeks when there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven there, they spoke different languages. The Holy Spirit enabled the disciples to testify and the multitude to be able hear the testimony in their own language. The Spirit even gave the disciples what to say, God's sovereign message. All were amazed and perplexed.

We see a glimpse of mankind's struggle with God's sovereignty. Some in the crowd denied this was anything special. They certainly didn't give consideration that this was from God. They said the disciples were drunk. The religious leaders did the same with Jesus, not giving God glory or credit for the message Jesus shared or the miracles he did. It is still a problem today. God's word is twisted to suit our liking; his power is denied; he is questioned for not doing enough (what we would like done); His existence is denied with "there is no God" or other gods are put before him.

Peter tells them in Acts 2:23 Jesus was delivered because of God's definite plan and foreknowledge to be crucified, and they were the ones who turned him over to the Romans to carry it out. Many were convicted that day and 3000 believed the gospel that was given to them. There were those in Jerusalem that day who did not believe. God's plan and pursuit of lost souls did not end there. As the early church was formed we are told how they lived and what they did. Others outside of the church were drawn to them and they gave them favor. We are told day by day God added to their number those who were being saved.

We see God's sovereignty over every soul on the day of Pentecost as he drew nearly 3000 to himself. The beginning of the Church comes, providing a way for believers to live in community with each other and Him. God sent His only son to die as a sacrifice so that we could have life. He sent the Holy Spirit to be our helper in this life and show us truth. He invites the Church to join Him in sharing the gospel to those who don't know or believe in Him so that they too might be added to His kingdom.

Appendix 1

Finding Our Place in the Story of the Gospel

Stories are an essential part of who we are as humans. At the most basic level, we are constantly engaged in a wide range of stories, whether it is streaming a tv series online, immersing ourselves in an engrossing novel, or even interacting on social media. Stories, however, are more fundamental in their significance and are more formative in their substance, for they give shape to how we understand the world in which we live, and move, and have our being. It is within the framework of narrative that our beliefs, actions, and desires are given meaning, which in turn reinforces the narrative we are living out day to day. It thus makes sense that we are so drawn to stories, because life itself is an immersive drama in which we take part.

Whether we realize it or not, the world is constantly offering a variety of powerful stories that attempt to sell us a vision of the "good life" in order to form the way we believe, act, and love. For example, the narrative of consumerism tells us that the "good life" is characterized by having more and more possessions, which not only informs our understanding of happiness, but forms the way we live our lives. If we are not careful, we may be living out a story offering cheap happiness, while only giving despair.

But by his grace, God has revealed the true story of our lives through his Word that counteracts the narratives the world has to offer. In Scripture, we are presented with the meta-narrative arc of Creation, Fall, Redemption, and Restoration: In the beginning, God created a good world, in which humanity, made in his image, was to represent the gracious reign of the Creator by causing the world to flourish and filling the world with his glory (Creation). Yet, the very creatures who were to represent God's gracious rule, rebelled against their Creator, wreaking havoc on themselves and on the world (Fall). Because of this rebellion, humanity's relationship with God, the world, and each other, is broken, leaving all of creation groaning for reconciliation with the Creator. But God in his rich mercy, sent his only Son to live out the story we could not, bringing reconciliation through his life, death, and resurrection (Redemption). Those who place their faith in Jesus Christ and are being formed by this story of the Gospel, faithfully proclaim the glory of God as they wait for the Creator and Redeemer to make all things new (Restoration).

The true story of the Gospel revealed in Scripture is the "good life" offered to us. It is in this grand story in which our individual stories make sense and find their proper place; and inasmuch as we immerse ourselves in this ultimate story, we faithfully bear witness to the

author and finisher of our faith. Yet, to immerse ourselves in this story does not mean to merely assent to the basic premises of Scripture (though that is essential), but to fully embody these truths in how we live our lives. We embody these truths in and through the daily habits (such as prayer, reading scripture, witnessing), weekly practices (such as the gathering as the corporate body of Christ to worship), and yearly rhythms (such as observing the seasons of Christmas and Easter). This is why as a church we are committed to these Gospel-shaped rhythms to form us as a people who exist to be a people who enjoy the glory of God, equip the people of God, and extend the love of God. We pray and hope that by God's grace and for his glory this guide will contribute to the alignment of our hearts, souls, and minds that we may live out the story of the Gospel to the glory of Christ, our King.

In fact, in the first century, the cross was such a well-known device for torture and death, that Cicero, a Roman philosopher and statesman, once said it was unbecoming for a Roman to even speak of it. But for the New Testament, the cross is presented as the place where Jesus is enthroned as King, where he is "lifted up" (John 12:32), for it is the place where Jesus has overthrown the worst of enemies: sin and death. In John 19, Jesus is given a royal robe, a crown of thorns, and a sign that proclaims that he is King. Given the context, all these gestures seem to be a mockery of Jesus and his claim to be the Son of God. And while this may be the intention, the actual irony is that Jesus is presented as the one true King of God's Kingdom, through his death and resurrection, in which he is the conquering hero who has conquered death itself. Therefore, the cross is a perfect symbol to represent God's reign over life and death.



Week 2 | The Crown God Reigns over Creation

The crown has obvious royal connotations, but what does it have to do with creation? And why the image of a crown in relation to the created order? First of all, in the ancient world, the divine being who was responsible for creation was considered to be the king, sovereign over all the gods. In this sense, creation imagery is closely tied to royal imagery throughout the ancient word, and specifically in the Bible. We can see this link between creation and kingship in Psalm 93, where it says, "Yahweh reigns; he is robed in majesty; Yahweh is robed; he has put on strength as his belt. Yes, the world is establish; it shall never be moved. Your throne is established from of old; you are from everlasting" (vv.1-2). Second, in the creation account of Genesis 1-2, humanity has been called the "crown of creation," since they are made in the image of God, tasked to rule over his created order. In Psalm 8, it says that God has "crowned him with glory and honor" (v.5). Of course, humanity failed (and fails) in their royal task, bringing about chaos instead of order. Therefore, as the Son of God became the

Son of Man, taking on the full royal responsibility given to the first Adam, he reconciles everything in heaven and earth by his blood. In fact, it is "by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him" (Colossians 1:16). Through creation and redemption, Jesus is thus crowned as Lord over the heavens and the earth, and all that is in them.



Week 3 | The Scepter God Reigns over the Nations

The scepter is an ornamented staff that symbolized the sovereignty of a ruler. It thus became an image associated with the judgment of the king, especially over and against his enemies. In Scripture, it says that God rules with a scepter (Psalm 45:6, 110:2), and with a rod judges the nations (Psalm 2:9). Psalm 2 vividly portrays God's judgment over the nations who rage against him. Yet, it is his Messiah, the Anointed One, the true King, whom Yahweh has set over all nations, warning them to be wise and serve Yahweh with fear and rejoice with trembling (2:10-11). It is all the more remarkable, even a mystery as Paul says (Ephesians 3:6), that in the Messiah's rule the nations will be grafted in (Romans 11:17), taking part in the gathering of the redeemed. To this end, Jesus charges his followers to make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:18-20), which will lead to the Kingdom of God being comprised of a "great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb" (Revelation 7:9).



Week 4 | The Throne God Reigns over Suffering

The throne is the ceremonial seat upon which a king sits, representing his rule and place of authority. So, what might this have to do with suffering? While such an image may carry a sense of a sovereign, detached from those of his royal subjects, especially those marginalized in society, the image of Jesus sitting at the right hand of the Father is a powerful picture of his empathetic intercession for his beloved in all situations throughout all time (Romans 8:31–39). In particular, the author of Hebrews reflects upon this very concept. He says, "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (4:15–16). We are able to draw near to this throne with confidence, because Jesus Christ, the one who has fully embraced and entered into all our suffering and knows it even better than we do, "is seated at the right hand of the throne of God" (8:1), always making intercession for us. Therefore, any and all suffering we experience, we have a

King who became an outcast on our behalf, who sits on the throne praying for us now, and will one day, make "all the sad things in this world come untrue."



Week 5 | The Sword God Reigns over Sin

The sword symbolizes the warfare that the King wages against his enemies. In Scripture, sin is the open rebellion against God and his kingdom. Therefore, the sword represents God's righteous judgment against all sin, transgression, iniquity, and idolatry. And just as Jesus Christ takes on the full righteous judgment of God on our behalf, God is both the just King and the justifying Savior who makes us right with him (Romans 3:23-27). At the same time, the sword is directly associated with the Word of God (Ephesians 6:17), which is "living and active, sharper than any two-edge sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints, and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12). In this sense, the Sword of the Spirit (or the Word of God) is that which exposes our rebellion and thus becomes a surgical instrument to put to death in us that is in rebellion to God. Therefore, the sword of the King not only brings righteous judgment, but also becomes the means by which we are made righteous before the judge, through the sanctification of the Holy Spirit.



Week 6 | The Mountain God Reigns over Time and Possessions

Although a mountain may not have overt connotations to royal imagery to modern worldview, in the ancient world it has direct associations with a king, and even more so, the divine. The ancient world had what could be called a "theological geography," in which to "go up," meant something significant: it was not merely a statement of upward physical movement, nor was it merely a metaphor-it was an actual approach to the heavenly realm. An obvious corollary to this reality is that mountains, specifically that of the Holy Mountain (Isaiah 11:9; 56:7), symbolized one's approach, ascent to God himself. Hence, Psalm 24, asks the question of questions for all humanity: "Who shall ascend the mountain of Yahweh? And who shall stand in his holy place?" The New Testament gives the resounding answer of Jesus of Nazareth, who is the one who ascended to the right hand of the Father. For this reason, the mountain symbolizes the Ascension of Jesus Christ, which is commemorated during week 6 of this season. In regard to God's reign over time and possessions, a mountain represents that which is ancient, even timeless-to stand before a mountain, one should feel small. Psalm 90, which is a poetic exposition on humanity's finitude of time and work, reflects upon the timelessness of God in relation to mountains: "Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God" (vv.1-2).



Week 7 God Reigns over the Church

The cup is meant to represent the royal cup of the king, symbolizing feasting and celebration, along with the fellowship with all those who share his table. In the New Testament, Jesus also refers to the cup that he is to drink as his suffering and death on the cross (Matthew 20:22-23), which is to be shared with all those who desire to follow him in his life and resurrection. Significantly, the cup of Jesus Christ's passion, the "cup of the new covenant" (Luke 22:20) is that which is commemorated in the Lord's Supper, to "proclaim the Lord's death until he comes" (1 Corinthians 11:26). It is for this wide ranging network of associations with the cup—the cup of God's wrath taken by Jesus Christ to grant us access to the fellowship with God; the cup of the New Covenant; the cup of the Lord's supper taken by the Church—that this image is used to represent God's reign over the Church.



Week 8 God Reigns over each Soul

There does not seem to be any direct correlation between royal imagery and fire. The rationale for this image is the obvious connection to the event of Pentecost, when "suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance" (Acts 2:2-4). However, there is a clear connection to this event and the empowerment the Spirit provides for the Church to live out the Kingdom of God throughout the world. And while fire is associated with the final judgment, it is the prayer of the Church and the desire of God our Savior that every soul "be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4). For this reason, let the Church be faithful to proclaim the Gospel throughout all of creation, that the King may be celebrated and worshipped with all the glory due his name.

Appendix 3

Praying the Lord's Prayer

In the Gospel of Matthew, the disciples asked Jesus to teach them to pray. Jesus responds with what is known as the "Lord's Prayer" (Matthew 6:9-13). In many ways, it is a comprehensive prayer, spanning from the desire to see God's Kingdom fully manifest to the basic need of our daily provision of bread. For this reason, our church fathers, Augustine, Martin Luther, and John Calvin utilized this "prayer of prayers" as a guide for their prayers to God. Following this wise and humble approach, we have provided a basic framework by which you may pray through the Lord's Prayer. The following takes each line of the Lord's Prayer and provides a particular focus along with a key passage to help guide your time in prayer. We have also provided an example prayer for each line.

Our Father who art in Heaven, Hallowed be Your Name
Thy Kingdom Come, Thy Will be Done, On Earth as it is in Heaven
Give us This Day our Daily Bread
Forgive us our Trespasses as we Forgive those who Trespass Against Us
Lead us not into Temptation but Deliver us from Evil
For Thine is the Kingdom, the Power, the Glory, Forever and Ever. Amen

"Our Father who art in Heaven, Hallowed be Your Name"

Focus: Humbly and confidently address God as our Father, recognizing that this relationship is only possible through the atoning work of His Son Jesus Christ. Glorify God by revering His Name above all Names.

Passage to Pray: Ephesians 1:3-6; John 1:9-13; Galatians 4:4-7; Romans 8:12-17; Proverbs 3:11-12; 1 John 3:1-3; Isaiah 6:1-13; Psalm 97

"Thy Kingdom Come, Thy Will be Done, On Earth as it is in Heaven"

Focus: Declare your desire that God's Kingdom would come, asking that God would manifest his reign in every part of the world and every part of our soul, where we see every type of sin, injustice, and evil. Pray that by his grace God would align our will to His, that we would see the uniting of heaven and earth, and that by the power of the Spirit we would contribute to the coming of his Kingdom.

Passages to Pray: Psalm 145:1-3; Zechariah 14:9; Psalm 93; Matthew 26:36-46; Luke 12:32-34; Colossians 3:1-4; 2 Corinthians 5:18-20; Revelation 21:1-5a

"Give us This Day our Daily Bread"

Focus: Pray that God would provide all that you need for the day, recognizing your absolute dependence upon Him for all things at all times. Pray also for God's provision of others, since we are to pray for "our" daily bread.

Passages to Pray: Philippians 4:6-7, 19; Psalm 34; Psalm 104; 1 Peter 5:6-7; Matthew 6:26; Matthew 7:7-11; 1 Timothy 2:1; Ephesians 6:18

"Forgive us our Trespasses as we Forgive those who Trespass Against Us"

Focus: Confess your sins that you have sinned against God in thought, word, and deed; for what you have done and for what you have left undone. In light of God's forgiveness granted to you because of the atoning work of Jesus Christ, offer forgiveness for those who have sinned against you.

Passages to Pray: Psalm 51:1-4; Psalm 103:8-13; 1 John 1:5-10; Daniel 9:16-19; Colossians 3:12-13; Matthew 6:14-15; Ephesians 4:1-2, 31-32

"Lead us not into Temptation but Deliver us from Evil"

Focus: Pray for God's protection in your life from evil in this world, from the evil within, and from the evil one. Also take time to pray for God's protection in the lives of others.

Passages to Pray: 1 Corinthians 10:12-13; Psalm 20; Psalm 23; Isaiah 41:10-13; Ephesians 6:10-18; 2 Thessalonians 3:1-5; James 1:12-15

"For Thine is the Kingdom, the Power, the Glory, Forever and Ever. Amen"

Focus: Proclaim, rejoice, and take heart in the truth that the Kingdom, the Power, and the Glory belong to God. Glorify God for who He is and for what He does. With your "amen" submit all your requests to God, trusting in His infinite wisdom that He will respond according to His glory and for our ultimate good.

Passages to Pray: 1 Chronicles 29:10b-13; Psalm 27; Job 26:7-14; Isaiah 40:12-17; Ephesians 1:17-21; Romans 11:36; Psalm 106:48; Revelation 7:9-12
