

Read John 2:1-12

- 1. It seems from the text that Mary wasted no time taking her need to Jesus. In this story, she provides for us an example of how and *when* we can take things to Jesus. What your typical checklist of things you run through before taking it to Jesus or do you speak to him immediately? How can you train yourself to go to him more quickly?
- 2. Mary also gives us an example of what we are able to ask of Jesus. Though honor and family relationships were at play- she did ask Jesus to do something about wine. How does this example push you in *what* you are willing and ready to take to the Lord?
- 3. Something happens between vs 4 and 5 that we can't see. Jesus is given the green light by the Father to "go". And with that permission, he steps into the light of the world to begin his public ministry. What is your rhythm on waiting and listening for instructions from the Spirit?
- 4. Mary says maybe the most prolific instructions for the servants and for our life-"Whatever He tells you, do it." How do you think we can learn to obey like this? What are the hurdles you typically have to obedience in the most difficult ways?

5.	With Jesus- we can ask anything, but we must yield everything. What are the things in this life that are most difficult for you to give over to him?
