

Read John 13:31-38 Discussion Questions:

How does Jesus' example of steadfast obedience challenge us to glorify God in our own lives, especially during difficult times?

In what ways can we practically demonstrate the kind of love for one another that Jesus commands, particularly within our church community?

How might our relationships and witness to the world change if we truly loved others 'as Jesus has loved us'?

What barriers prevent us from confronting sin in ourselves and others with the same directness and compassion that Jesus showed?

How does Jesus' foreknowledge of Peter's denial, coupled with His continued love and restoration, speak to God's grace in our own failures?

In what areas of your life do you need to embrace Jesus' presence and forgiveness, even when you feel unworthy or distant from Him?

How does the image of Jesus determinedly moving towards the cross, despite knowing the suffering ahead, inspire or challenge your own faith journey?

What does it mean for us to 'lay down our lives' for Jesus in today's context, and how can we prepare ourselves to do so?

How can we cultivate a deeper appreciation for Jesus' sacrificial love, as demonstrated in His willingness to endure the cross for our sake?

In what ways can we, as individuals and as a church, better embody the kind of love that Jesus says will show the world we are His disciples?
