

Small Group Guide: Fellowship with God (1 John 1:1-10)

Opening Prayer

Key Takeaways:

- 1. We are invited into a real and personal relationship with God.
- 2. Fellowship with God produces a joy that cannot be matched by this world.
- 3. Sin is a terminal disease that's part of our nature and the choices we make.
- 4. God forgives and cleanses us when we confess our sins.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. The sermon mentions that we're "invited into a real and personal relationship, an intimate fellowship with God." What does this mean to you personally? How does this concept challenge or encourage you?
- 2. John writes that fellowship with God leads to complete joy. How have you experienced joy through your relationship with God, especially during difficult times?
- 3. The sermon discusses misconceptions about sin. How do you typically view sin in your own life? Do you tend to ignore it, obsess over it, or something else?
- 4. Reflect on the story of the Prodigal Son. How does this parable illustrate God's attitude towards us when we confess our sins?
- 5. The speaker mentions that "if you've ever confessed the same sin twice, you've confessed one too many times." How does this statement impact your understanding of God's forgiveness?
- 6. In light of recent world events mentioned in the sermon, how does our fellowship with God help us navigate through dark and troubling times?

Practical Applications:

- 1. This week, set aside time each day for personal reflection. Examine areas in your life where you might be "walking in darkness" and bring these to God in confession.
- 2. Practice gratitude by keeping a joy journal. Each day, write down one way you've experienced joy through your relationship with God.
- 3. Reach out to someone who might be struggling with guilt or shame. Share the message of God's forgiveness and cleansing with them.
- 4. Memorize 1 John 1:9: "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Closing Prayer:

Thank God for His invitation to fellowship and His promise of forgiveness. Ask for His help in walking in the light and experiencing the joy of a close relationship with Him.
